


Aditi shook her head. She sat down and did not look up. She did not even answer 'Present!' when the class teacher called out her name.


One day, Mini, the milkmaid was going to the market. She was carrying a pail of milk on her head.

He went to Mrs. Chopra and thanked her. He said to her, 'You are brave and clever'. He took her inside the shop and gave her a gold ring. He said, 'This is my way of saying, 'Thank you!'

Mrs. Chopra thanked the shopkeeper but she didn't accept the gold ring. She said, 'I am a good citizen and a good citizen is not paid for being one.'
